2008 RACE TO ANY PLACE

For the past three years the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh has participated in the Race to Any Place, presented by UPMC and sponsored by GNC. This race is the largest stationary bike race in Western Pennsylvania, and an important team fund-raising event benefiting the Western Pennsylvania and West Virginia Chapter of the Leukemia and Lymphoma Society. This year the race was held on February 23, 2008 at the U.S. Steel Tower.

The Race to Any Place is a six-hour relay race, comprised of twenty-four 15 minute heats. Each branch of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh entered a team and each team was responsible for raising \$500.00 per team that was donated to the Leukemia & Lymphoma Society. The two teams from North Boroughs YMCA raised \$2,300 and the two teams from Baierl Family YMCA raised \$2,000. The YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh Association raised over \$11,000. The North Boroughs YMCA teams rode a total of 338.06 miles, the Baierl Family YMCA rode a total of 338.69 miles and our Association logged a total of 3,119 miles.

MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN



By the time this letter reaches the press the first quarter of 2008 will be nearly completed. Of course the board is extremely busy with a variety of items; however, at this time of year much of our attention is focused on our annual fundraising campaign "Building

Strong Communities". There are other articles in this newsletter that will explain all of the fine work and benefits that this YMCA provides our community. It is your financial support that makes all of this possible. Please take the time to read over these articles, and know that your financial support is needed, appreciated, and put to very good use.

There are a few items I wanted to report that have taken place at the Wellness Center of the Baierl Family YMCA since our last newsletter. The staff has been listening to the members. Always trying to obtain the best equipment for the Wellness Center, we recently added 12 pieces of the Precor Strength Line. These are weight lifting machines versus free weights. This addition will accommodate more people in the Wellness Center, especially during busy times. Two Expresso bikes were also added. These are unique pieces of equipment that give the rider the feeling of steering through various venues. Words do not do this cycling equipment justice. You really need to try these for yourself.

The Baierl Family YMCA recently completed the Kids' Triathlon with 34 participants between the ages of 8 and 14 competing. The participants swam 100 yards, cycled two miles on the spin bikes, and ran one mile on the treadmill. In a time where childhood obesity is at record levels, this is a well needed and wonderful community event.

Finally, The Baierl Family YMCA has had another successful "Weight Loss Challenge" with

approximately 250 members trying to lose weight over an 8 week period. During this period some used personal trainers, some simply increased their exercise regimen, and some made adjustments to their diet. Many made all of these adjustments. Last year's winner lost approximately 35 pounds. This is but a small bit of the excitement that is taking place at the Baierl Family YMCA.

The North Boroughs YMCA has many accomplishments as well. The North Boroughs YMCA is still awaiting final approval to take over North Suburban Adult Services. This is an organization, located on the corner of California Avenue and S. Home Ave. at the Church of the Epiphany that has been serving senior citizens for over 30 years. Recently, because of financial difficulties the organization has seriously considered closing its doors. During this same time the North Boroughs YMCA has been looking for a way to get more involved with the senior citizen population and engage our current Silver Sneaker participants. North Suburban Adult Services and the North Boroughs YMCA was a natural partnership. The North Boroughs YMCA manages North Suburban Adult services while we wait for final approvals to merge the organizations. We currently continue to offer a Monday -Thursday lunch program, breakfasts, book clubs, and day trips. Soon we will promote the facility as the North Boroughs YMCA Community Center that will provide the following services:

- Senior Programming Thursday 9am 3pm involving various social and health activities
- Evening and Saturday morning fitness classes
- Women's health nights and Community Health fairs

As you can see the facility will serve a cross section of the entire community. For information about the new North Boroughs YMCA Community Center and its activities please feel free to contact Maureen Newcamp at the North Boroughs YMCA.

CAMP HIGH HOPES 2008

The North Boroughs and Baierl Family branches of the YMCA of Greater Pittsburgh are again proud to sponsor the 2008 Camp High Hopes Summer Day Camp.
